11:00 AM to 1:30 PM – Join us for our **Student Art Show** as we admire artwork of Georgia's resident and migratory birds created by local school children grades 1 to 5.

12:00 PM and 1:00 PM – Visit **The Amphibian Foundation**'s new home and conservation laboratory at Blue Heron Nature Preserve with **guided tours** through the amphibian room. Participants will be able to catch a glimpse at creatures such as poison dart frogs.

11:15 to 12:15 PM – Guided **Bird Walk** around the Blue Heron Nature Preserve. Bring your own binoculars or borrow a pair from us.

1:30 PM to 2:30 PM – **Meet and greet with Chris Wood**. Get the chance to speak with Cornell Lab of Ornithology's Assistant Director of Information Science who has worked on a number of projects such as eBird, Birds of North America, and Neotropical Birds.

- Atlanta Audubon will be hosting the National Audubon's 2016 Photography Awards travelling
  exhibit from March 23 through April 15. This exhibit features the winning 12 photographs selected
  from more than 7,000 entries.
- Enjoy meet and greets with some of the creatures from **The Amphibian Foundation** such as a Giant Toad and Red-Footed Tortoise. Staff will be on hand to discuss these animals.
- Discover what makes up the diet of owls and other raptors with a hands-on Owl Pellet
   Dissection. Learn about the eating habits of these animals as well as explore what types of indigestible material passes through their systems. We will be looking for feathers, bones, teeth, and other fun bits to help identify prey species.
